Pol Llonch graduated in veterinary medicine at the Autonomous University of Barcelona (UAB) in 2007 where he also completed a Master's degree in veterinary science. Later, he joined the Animal Welfare Department of the Institute of Research in Agri-food (IRTA) where he obtained a PhD on pig welfare. In 2012 he moved to the United Kingdom to work as a postdoc researcher at the University of Warwick first and the Scottish Rural College (SRUC) thereafter. During his postdoc, Dr Llonch was dedicated to the study of sheep and cattle behaviour and welfare. In 2015, Dr Llonch returned to Spain to work at the Department of Animal and Food Science of the School of Veterinary Science of UAB. During his career, Dr Llonch has published more than 50 peer reviewed papers and contributed to numerous conferences on applied animal behaviour and welfare. He regularly lectures farm animal behaviour and welfare to both undergraduate and postgraduate students, both at UAB and the University of Edinburgh (UK).
